





St Margaret's Anglican Girls School required additional classrooms due to an increase in secondary school enrolments. The modular solution was chosen due to the tight deadline and the desire for the new structure to blend in with existing school facilities.

ATCO worked with the schools architect Blight Raynor to design an astheically pleasing modular building to house two technology equipped classrooms. The building was designed, manufactured, and installed towards the end of 2021 over a 24 week period, ready for the new school year.

The 23 m x 10 m double classroom features broad verandahs, metal and timber decorative panneling, and roof to floor windows and louverd glass resulting in a bright and airy learning environment. The interior is fitted out with easy-clean surfaces, air conditioning, and high-quality fittings, resulting in a long lasting building that will withstand the test of time.
